

# EASTER - CHANGES EVERYTHING!

Some of you would remember the song by Andrew Lloyd Weber, "Love changes everything." Beautiful lyrics that highlight the power of love. I found two of the lines most interesting..."Love changes everything, hands, faces, earth and sky...Love changes everything, how you live and how you die!".

In keeping with the theme of the Herald for this Quarter, I thought I could easily replace the word "Love" with the word "Easter" or "Resurrection" for truly Easter and the Resurrection change everything, especially how we live - living in the **power** of the resurrection – and how we die – with the **hope** of the Resurrection.

In the greatest chapter of the Resurrection in the Bible – 1 Corinthians 15, the Apostle Paul makes his case for the importance of the Resurrection of Jesus by emphasizing the opposite. What if Christ had not been raised? What then? He then goes on to spell out a whole series of things that would have devastating consequences for the Christian and for the Christian faith (not forgetting the Church).

Beginning with verse 14, the Apostle Paul lists six consequences If the Resurrection of Jesus did not take place. The Apostles preaching (and ours too) is useless.,14. Our faith is empty and futile, 17. The Apostles are false witnesses, so we know nothing about God.(15). We are still in our sins (17). Those who have died in Christ are lost (18). And we are pathetically deluded, living in a world of make believe (19).

After having painted such a horribly dark picture, he changes everything with the use of the little word "But"! This three letter word changes everything in the passage, just like the Resurrection changes how we live and how we die. This is the Easter truth that matters and that makes the difference..." But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (20) And if that is the truth, then our faith in Christ isn't useless. It is the key to everything. Then the Apostles have not misrepresented God. Their message is the truth. Then we are no longer in our sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ are not lost but in the many rooms in the Father's house. Then we are not the deluded people, living in a world of make believe, but rather people to be envied, since we have the secret of life everlasting.

So, the Resurrection truly changes everything. Because Jesus lives we can face today and tomorrow, and live sustained by His

### RESURRECTION CHANGES EVERYTHING

Christians all over the World celebrate the resurrection of Christ Jesus on Easter Sunday faithfully and joyfully. Sunday has become special because of the resurrection. The resurrection of Jesus is genuine and glorious and has made an impact and brought changes that is a blessing indeed. Therefore the resurrection has to be stressed and remembered always in our Churches. I wish you all a meaningful Easter which brings hope and lasting happiness. The topic in this article must awaken us to realize and reckon the changes it has on Christ's position and power, the sad destiny of human-

ity, the power of the Christian and the impact and the changes upon the Church. As I write about this important topic I must honestly and humbly say that the resurrection of Christ has and will bring changes in everything. Let us learn its changes and bring a great desire to change our lives and serve faithfully.

Jesus the carpenter's Son was indeed humiliated and belittled and then was crucified at Calvary shamefully before a large mixed crowd but Jesus experienced resurrection to life as He claimed (John 2:18-22; Luke 24:6-7). Further the beautiful appearances of Christ after the resurrection made to individuals and groups as recorded in the Gospels and the brief recording in 1 Cor 15:5-8 by the Apostle Paul testify that Christ's resurrection event showed the view held in Jesus's day was imperfect. Thus Christ's resurrection cannot be dismissed.

Let us now focus on the changes the resurrection made on Christ our Lord. Let us firstly see in regards to His position. The Apostle Peter in the sermon on the day of Pentecost says that Jesus was called to the right hand of God (Acts 2:33a) The Apostle Paul says that Jesus was made to sit at His right hand in the heavenly realms. Further he says that Jesus is far above all rule, authority, power and domain and every title. Paul the Apostle says that God placed all things under His feet (Eph 1:20b, 21-22b). He was made head over everything (Eph 1:22b) Paul also says that Jesus will be the future Judge (Acts 17:30-31) and His name is exalted (Phil 2:9-11). In Christ's lofty position could He make an impact or bring change on the social, political and other structures He can. Further be involved in the future activities with God for He reigns with Him. The resurrection of Christ guaranties that God will one day transform all creation (1Cor 15:20-28). Secondly let us see the changes on His power He enables us to have the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:33; John 7:39) which did happen. Christ resurrection will be able to free us from the curse of sin and its power. Further from death and free us from the devil (Rom 6:11-14; Heb 2:14-15) we will after death enjoy the resurrection (1 Cor 15:13,21).

The resurrection of Christ gives hope that the destiny of humanity and their cultures can be restored from sin and death and experience Christ if they believe. Further enjoy the resurrection. The resurrection of Christ has changed and will change humanity and their cultures in the future to live for Him.

Let us see the changes the resurrection brings upon the power of Christians, they are secure with Christ (Eph 2: 4, 6) and enjoy the new birth and a living hope (1 Peter 1:3). These blessings will enable Christians to overcome temptations the power of sin (Rom 6:10-14) and discern situations (Rom 8:35-39) because we have the love of Christ. Therefore we can be more than conquerors in Christ. (Rom 8:37). We too will enjoy the resurrection (1Cor 15:42ff). As God's workmanship we are able in doing good works thus Christians can be fruitful and excel (Eph 2:10).

Let us see the impact and changes made on the Church by the resurrection for if Jesus Christ was not raised we will not have the Church but the Church began with Pentecost and thereafter grew steadily. The Church the body of Christ (Rom 12:5; Eph 1:22-23) was able to enjoy His power and presence. Jesus in His great commission to the disciples shows its truth (Matt 28:18 ff). Thus the Church can be fruitful and enjoy His peace and be strong. The Church has the responsibility to proclaim and teach the resurrection not only on Easter Sunday but in all situations. Thus all who listen and experience transformation will be able to honor Christ through their lives. The resurrection power can enable the Church to be united and in that make her presence felt in the Church and the society. The resurrection must guide the Church to grow and be fruitful.

As I conclude this article I would like to ask you to thank God for the resurrection. May the peace of the resurrection be with you always and strengthen you.

## Has The Resurrection changed anything?

For hundreds of years, the prophets in Israel had foretold the coming of a Saviour. Then, in the fulness of time—about 2000 years ago—God sent forth His Son, Jesus of Nazareth. At the age of thirty, Jesus began His public ministry. He was a worker of mighty miracles, but he was more than this. He was God; and because He claimed to be God, He was crucified.

Jesus Himself had said that He would suffer many things and be crucified but that He would rise again on the third day. When His enemies asked for a sign that He was the Son of God, Jesus said that He would give them one sign—the sign of Jonah the prophet. He explained,


"For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth." (Matthew 12:40)

In effect, Jesus said, "I will be crucified, but I will rise again on the third day. My resurrection will prove that I am what I claim to be."

#### The Risen Christ appeared to His disciples

He was crucified, and He did rise again on the third day. After His resurrection, the Lord Jesus was on the earth forty days. During this time, He was seen by many of His followers, on one occasion by a group of 500. The first to have the joy of seeing Him was Mary Magdalene. Later He appeared to ten of the apostles with Thomas absent. When the disciples told Thomas that Jesus had risen, he did not believe them. Jesus appeared to the apostles again, and this time Thomas was present. When he saw the Lord Jesus, Thomas worshipped Him saying, "...my Lord and my God." (John 20:28) The resurrection of Jesus Christ is one of the greatest facts of all history. Each year Christians the world over celebrate His resurrection from the dead. But what does this great event really mean?

#### 1) The Resurrection proved Christ's claims




Jesus said, "I and My Father are one." (John 10:30) And "He who has seen Me has seen the Father." (John 14:9) If Jesus Christ were not what He claimed to be, He would be an imposter and a deceiver and could not even be called a good man. But His resurrection proves that He is exactly what He claimed to be.

The Bible says that Jesus Christ is "declared to be the Son of God with power...by the resurrection from the dead." (Romans 1:4)

This is the meaning of the resurrection—that **Jesus Christ is God**, and everything He said is true. Our Chris-

tian faith rests upon His resurrection, and our faith is not in vain.

#### 2) The Resurrected Lord paid our sin debt



Jesus said, "just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." (Matthew 20:28) He did give His life in payment for our sins, and the resurrection shows us that God has fully accepted that payment, and that our sins are forgiven.

In ancient days, when a man owed a debt and could not pay it, he was cast into a debtor's prison. He remained there until the debt was paid. If he was seen out of prison later, it meant one thing—the debt had been paid.

We owed a great debt of sin—"the wages of sin is death..." (Romans 6:23) We could not pay it,

but the Lord Jesus went into the debtor's prison of death for us. He remained there three days and three nights, and then He came forth alive forever more. He is a living Savior, and His resurrection proves that our debt of sin has been fully paid. And the wonderful thing is that God not only forgives our sins for Jesus' sake, but He forgets them! God says, "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more." (Hebrews 10:17)

#### 3) The Resurrection opened the gateway to life




Jesus said, "Because I live, you will live also." (John 14:19) Because of the resurrection, death need hold no fear for Christians. Those who have received Christ have everlasting life, and no power in the universe can take that life from them. For Christians, death is not the end of life but rather the gateway into real life.

Because of their faith in the resurrection, Christians of all ages have been able to face death without fear. Dr. J.G.

Fleming tells how that the rebels during the Boxer Rebellion in China, captured a mission school, blocked

all gates but one, and placed a cross on the ground before it. Word was sent in that anyone who trampled on that cross could go free but that anyone who would not trample on it would be killed. The first seven of the young people trampled on the cross and were allowed to go free. The eighth, a girl, knelt before the cross and was shot instantly. All the rest in a line of a hundred students followed her example.



These young people believed in the resurrection, and they were willing to lay down their lives for their faith. They are alive today in heaven, and they will always be honored in a special way as those who laid down their lives for their Savior.

#### 4) The Resurrection proclaimed the Good News



The Gospel is good news, and the good news is that God's Son died for our sins and rose again the third day to be our living Savior. If you will open your heart to Him, He will gladly come in. He will be your friend during this pilgrim journey on earth: and then one day, He will take you to live with Him forever in Heaven.

Because of the resurrection, the Apostle Paul actually looked forward to death. He said,

"For me to live is Christ [His life in me], and to die is gain." (Philippians 1:21)

Death can be the greatest gain or be the greatest loss. It all depends on what you do with Jesus.



Jesus went to pray in the garden. He prayed for God's will to be done. While Jesus was there, soldiers came to take him away.








Jesus died on the cross. His friends were very sad. They had forgotten what Jesus had said. Jesus had told his friends that he would






Jesus came to see his friends. He showed them his hands and feet. Jesus was alive!

# Embracing the other

This is the fifth and last article in our series on marriage based on Tim Keller's book, *The Meaning of Marriage*. There is still one area we have not dealt with, and that is gender specific roles in marriage. I know that this is a controversial subject today, even in the church, but that is no reason to not talk about it.

I think it helps to start at the Beginning, to look at God's purpose for marriage and gender roles. We know that God created man and women equal in the garden, both were given the mandate to care for the garden and to multiply. Genesis 2 tells us that among all the things in the creation that were good, when God looked at Adam He said it was "not good" for him to be alone. So, he used a rib from Adam to make Eve as a "helper" for Adam, a companion. Many people take the word helper to mean servant, but that is not the meaning in Hebrew. The work "'ezer" in the Old Testament is mostly used to refer to God as our helper, certainly not a subservient role. It can also be used when the military is called to "help" in a battle. The idea is to "make up what is lacking in another person with your strength". That was God's idea when he created Eve.

The word "suitable" also carries the idea of being complementary, Literally, it would be "like-opposite", they are "two pieces of a puzzle that fit together because they are not exactly alike, not randomly different, but they are differentiated, such that together they can create a complete whole."

No one can deny that men and women are very different in physical and emotional makeup. God created us different, but equal, so we could be complementary, sharing the load, and meeting all the needs. When you think of raising children, you can see the value in the differences. Women should not ignore the differences and try to be "like men", but to understand the gift of who God meant us to be. It is not that we can't do what the man can do, but that we need to find what roles God has made for us. What fits best with the way he made YOU! This can vary between individuals. It requires some thought as to how to apply it in your marriage.

You must have the same attitude

that Christ Jesus had.

Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. Instead, he gave up his divine privileges; he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross.

Therefore, God elevated him to the place of highest honor and gave him the name above all other names, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue declare that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 2:5-11



In Philippians 2:5-11 we see Jesus as the "servant" submitting to the Father in his role as the sacrifice for our sins. We talked in earlier articles about men taking the "Jesus role" to love their wives as Christ loved the Church (Eph. 5:25-30) This is an example for women to take the "Jesus role" by submitting to their husbands in the same way as Jesus did in order to secure our salvation. This fulfills the "helper" role.

Let me quote Kathy Keller:

This is one part of the glory of marriage, in the Biblical conception. Two people of different sexes make the commitment and sacrifice that is involved in embracing the Other. It is often painful and always complicated, but it helps us grow and mature in ways no other experience can produce, and it brings about deep unity because of the profound complementarity between the sexes. This has nothing to do with who brings home the biggest salary or who makes the most sacrifices to care for the children....the tender, serving authority of a husband's headship and the strong, gracious gift of a

wife's submission restore us to who we are meant to be at creation."

Within our homes we can be a window to a restored society, where gender leads us to deeper understanding of ourselves and our spouse, with men as the "servant leader" and women as the "strong helper."

The Bible is not very specific on how this should be worked out in the home, other than through examples in various Bible stories. Everyone knows that women are more nurturing, hence they have the child rearing roles, (1 Peter 3:1-2, 4). I always encourage women that if they can it is good to be at home when the kids are little, but sometimes that is not possible.

In the same way, you wives must accept the authority of your husbands. Then, even if some refuse to obey the Good News, your godly lives will speak to them without any words. They will be won over by observing your pure and reverent lives.

Don't be concerned about the outward beauty of fancy hairstyles, expensive jewelry, or beautiful clothes. You should clothe yourselves instead with the beauty that comes from within, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is so precious to God. 1 Peter 3:1-4

Men are directed more often to lead, provide for and protect, but that doesn't alleviate them from responsibility in training their children (Eph. 6:4, 1Tim. 3:8). What if there are no jobs out there for

them? They should not be threatened if their wives have bigger salaries or positions than they do. And if it is necessary for the wife to work outside the home, the husband should always be ready to help with matters in the home.

Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger by the way you treat them. Rather, bring them up with the discipline and instruction that comes from the Lord. Ephesians 6:4

Discuss these things and work them out.

Even the Kellers explain that at one time they became overextended and Kathy had to go to work for a while in order to make ends meet. This meant that Tim had to take care of the children getting off to school, etc. We all have to adjust to make the household work smoothly. We should not leave everything to do with "home" to the wife. And if you read about the excellent wife in Proverbs 31, she wasn't sitting around at home watching teledramas. She also was doing what she could to increase the income of the home.



Marriage can help us as individuals by looking at situations we face in different ways. By living closely with this person who is "like-opposite", so different from you, you can begin to see the world as they do, gaining their perspective, and responding more

appropriately. If we try to understand the others perspective, to "embrace it" so to speak, we can achieve a unity more like the one God created for us, before sin messed up our relationships.


Just think of the example we will be to the world around us.

#### Travel.

The Rev Faber and Rev Nelson took part in the General Synod of the Reformed Churches in the Netherlands (RCN) held from the 30th of January to the 3rd of February this year. The CRCSL was restored to the sister church relationship in 2014 with the Reformed Churches in The Netherlands (Liberated) (RCN-L) a federation of orthodox, reformed churches in The Netherlands. The RCN and RCN-L formed a Committee for Relations Abroad (CRA) on the 1st of May 2023. The "Verre Naasten" (Distant Neighbours) and "Steunpunt Kerkenwerk" (Church Work Support Centre) located at the CRA secretariat have been assigned to facilitate this work. CRCSL is also a beneficiary of this work.

The synod dealt with subject matters such as 'Responding to LGBTQ+ within the church community' 'being a confessing church while living the confessed faith', and 'Gospel and Muslims.' The delegates also visited the community centre and drop-in centre in a multicultural part of Utrecht. The visit to the Theological University of Utrecht enabled exploring the possibility of benefitting from our reformed heritage. Rev Nelson was interviewed by a publication on the topic of rituals and reformed traditions from African and Asian viewpoints.

The visit also provided an opportunity to discuss a comprehensive project proposal for the Conservation of ancient church buildings of CRCSL that are protected under the Archaeological Act with Sri Lanka and Netherlands Foundation.



## **Dying and Rising**

his story is based on a true story: Once upon a time there was a girl who grew up in a dysfunctional home. She had been raised by a single parent. As she grew older, she saw her mother become addicted to drugs, and as a result she suffered from neglect and was parentified at an early age. She lived in a situation that made her the built-in babysitter because her mother often would leave the younger siblings with her. She missed a lot of school. She had to make big decisions no child should have to worry about. How would she eat? Would she go to school today or stay with the siblings? Where was Mom? She grew up in a situation that made her act out in inappropriate ways. She sought ways to cope with her frustrations and pain. Did I mention she was a Christian? Yep, since she was 11 years old. However, she did not see how Jesus could speak into her current

situation Monday through Saturday. Sundays were cool, though; she was able to go to church. But the preacher did not do a good job of helping her see how Jesus mattered for everyday life.

This brings me to a point. Easter is a season where we learn of the resurrection of our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ. Every year we teach and share the good news that he is risen. We remember that all our sins are paid for, that Christ took the punishment we so deserved, and that we get the gift of eternal life and a new status: heir and forgiven child of God. That is good news. I happen to believe that although Advent is important and the inauguration of the kingdom of God on earth is vital, the resurrection is far more important because our sin debt was paid in full at the moment Jesus said, "It is finished." The fact that he rose is the part that encourages me. Many important people live and die, but because he is alive again and

dies no more, it gives me hope. Our old life also dies, and a new life arises in its place.

Playing on the English meaning of the word "testament," I was recently thinking about insurance policies, because I'm at that age. I am married and have children. Sooner or later I'm going to go home to be with the Lord. When that happens, I want to make sure my affairs are in order and my estate is dispersed to my family in the way I wish it to be. As a family we go to see a lawyer who helps us plan our estate. I designate my wife as benefactor. I have assets I want our children to receive. I name who gets what. It's my last will and testament. Isn't it interesting that the good news of Jesus is found in the New Testament? The good news of Christ's resurrection is found in God's "last will and testament" to us, where all of his promises to us are "Yes and amen!" And then Jesus died! When Jesus died, all the heavenly

inheritance was unlocked and passed to us by faith. We have inherited it because the proof of death was shown to the Father. Then Jesus changed the game when he rose from the dead. That. Changed. Everything.

If the resurrection didn't happen, then none of this matters, and I suppose you can live however you want, do whatever you want, and sin to your heart's content. But because the resurrection did happen, it changed everything. Now how we live matters. Now we have hope that God will sort out everything. Now we can tell people there's more to life than the repetitive rat race, the corporate ladder, and the life that is shallowly glazed over with pleasures and frivolous living. There is more to life thanks to the resurrection of Christ. The resurrection means God has the last say, and that word is good for those who hope in Jesus, live in Jesus, and die in Jesus. The resurrection truly does matter.

It mattered for the girl. What happened to her? She got involved in a Christian group in college, and they walked with her. They helped her sort out her pain and disappointments. They were the church to her. She also met her now-spouse in the group. Thanks to the newfound hope that the resurrection gave her, she was able to talk to her now-sober mom about the past and reconcile. Things are improving in their relationship. She also has a therapist that helps her rewrite some of the unhelpful scripts and internalization that happened in her early life. She began the long and slow process to put away the things in her old life and embrace the new life in Christ. She is going to be OK.

All of the strength to do all of this comes from the fact that she serves a risen Savior who has helped her along the way, encouraged her when she made mistakes, wiped her tears, and

hugged her scarred soul. We serve a wounded Savior who hugs us with his wounded hands as if to say, "I too have wounds, and I understand." The girl is now a woman with a family of her own. She has broken the generational curses of addictions and poverty. She gives all glory and credit to God for breaking unhealthy cycles and patterns in her life. That is why the resurrection matters: because the power God used to raise Jesus from the dead is present and available to every believer.

Our God is also one who works with those in between death and life. Some of us don't have such a triumphant story and are still waiting for God to do miraculous things. Some of us are waiting for God to do small things. History has shown us that prayer doesn't always get answered immediately. Sometimes it doesn't get answered at all, or if it does, it is in ways far different from what we expect. Our God works there too. We have a faith that says we trust the Lord when we get the answer, and we trust when we don't. We trust not in manifested blessings, but a God who is able. He is who he is whether we get the answer to prayer or not. We have a relationship with the Creator of the universe, who came down into

the middle of difficult circumstances and therefore understands firsthand the already-but-not-yet nature of our world. He meets us where the longing still is, where the kingdom has come but not yet fully. The resurrection of God's Son is a promise that things will get better, and he sits with us in the difficult times, the pain, the waiting, the disappointments, and the setbacks. He sits with us either way—on the high mountain or in the low valley. We serve a God who loves us that much.

Our God is one that specializes in bringing dead things back to life. Sin has put to death many things, including relationships with God and with one another. But thanks be to God that we serve a risen Savior who can give us new life! Our life with him changes, and our life with one another changes as well. And if he can help that little girl, he can help you as well. Our God is a helper.
